Since Managebac will be there already, we are asking they present MYP specific information to us during our first break-out session that includes “The Next Chapter” and changes that will be made for next year. The second breakout session will be about either assessment rubrics that are task specific or MYP projects.</p> <p>Finally, MYP will be presenting during our whole-group meeting on November 18th to share with DP and PYP the key components of the Middle Years Program. We decided to present this as a group, since it takes a village to understand MYP. I will be sending out a Power Point for input on several key components to share. Pam will send the link to the survey to the coordinators, who will complete the survey. It was agreed that this would be good to help promote the IB program. The collective data will be posted on the AZIBS website.</p> <p>2. Simplifying the Diploma Requirements. Pam asked if anyone had any more information on the new requirements. Some coordinators had reviewed the packet, but were not sure of exactly how to interpret it as it is confusing. It was thought that the new requirements will have more incentive for candidates to take 4HL exams because they would need to earn 12 points (instead of 16) in the top 3 HL scores and earn 24 total points (instead of 28). Jake mentioned the packet is posted on IBIS in the library. Pam said she would e-mail IB once again to find out if we were clear on the expectations regarding the 4HL exams. She will then forward response to coordinators.</p> <p>3. Julie mentioned the new IB exam registration screen and the ability to use an excel spreadsheet to upload the registrations onto IBIS. If coordinators use Managebac, they would not be using IBIS to register anyhow. Pam mentioned that there may be a way to register groups of students for a particular subject at once.</p> <p>4. Joe shared the situation with the ASU College of Life Sciences where his student was granted IB Bio credits but the college of life science asked the student to decline the credits because the medical school they apply to in 4 years may not accept the IB credit, which would cause a problem. He also mentioned that the college of life sciences is charging a fee to it's students who are not told about this until they visit the college. It was proposed that the board meet with ASU as a group to clarify the policy.</p> <p>5. Roundtables were discussed for February. The coordinators had the interest in offering Theatre, Group 4 IA, Visual Arts, Language B and DP Managebac. Joe agreed to facilitate the Managebac breakout.
